DIRECTOR BIOGRAPHIES

Mark Rankin is a Canadian independent filmmaker, musician and actor. *James 'Super Chikan' Johnson – A Life in Blues*, is Mark's first feature length film. Mark's previous writing, directing and scoring collaborations have included numerous award-winning short films, music videos and a web series. Mark has also worked as an actor having appeared in numerous Apple and Netflix productions. Mark is also the lead guitarist and songwriter with the popular Vancouver blues/rock band, The Mojo Stars.

Brian Wilson is a Canadian independent filmmaker and screenplay writer who has cowritten and co-directed short films, music videos and a web series. *James 'Super Chikan' Johnson – A Life in Blues*, is Brian's first feature length documentary film. With a background in post-secondary education and educational technology, Brian is fundamentally motivated by the power of story as a means of exploring complex and dramatic themes in an accessible and engaging manner.

Where is Super Chikan from? Super Chikan was born in Clarksdale, Mississippi, a town he calls home to this day. Clarksdale has a long and storied history, being the birthplace of such historical blues players as Ike Turner, Big Jack Johnson and Sam Cooke. Currently, Clarksdale is home to Christone 'Kingfish' Ingram, one of the rising stars of the contemporary blues scene.

What is a diddley bow? A diddley bow is traditionally a one-stringed instrument based on the Kora, which has influenced the development of the blues. Super Chikan is well known for hand crafting his own diddley bows which are much in demand for their creative and colourful designs.

How did you meet Super Chikan? We met Chikan when we brought him to Vancouver in 2018 to do a series of shows with Mark's band, The Mojo Stars. Immediately taken with Chikan's passion for life and his life-long commitment to his music, we approached him to see if he would be interested in having a documentary made on his life. Chikan was enthusiastic and once the pandemic had ended, we headed to Mississippi to start filming.

How would you describe Super Chikan's music? Super Chikan's music is a wonderful combination of deep blues, infused with his own Country influences, most of which can be heard in the storytelling nature of his lyrics.

What impact has making this film had on you as filmmakers? Making this film has given us a much deeper appreciation of the richness of the blues and the Delta in general. Not only did we get a chance to spend some great time with Super Chikan, but met many wonderful people throughout Mississippi. Upon returning home after filming, we realized just how much Delta culture has gotten into our blood!

Is James 'Super Chikan' Johnson related to Robert Johnson? Yes, he is! Chikan's grandfather was Johnson's first cousin, and not only was his grandfather related to the famed bluesman, but he also often played accompanying fiddle with Johnson.

Are there any special screenings for the film coming up? Yes, The filmmakers, Mark Rankin and Brian Wilson, have been invited to screen the film at the world-famous Notodden blues Festival in Notodden, Norway in July/August, 2025. Super Chikan will also be performing.

Who else is featured in the film? Among others, A Life in blues features interviews with Grammy Award Winners, Cedric Burnside, Charlie Musselwhite and Bobby Rush.

Has Chikan ever been featured on a TV program?

Yes. Super Chikan was featured in an episode of 60 Minutes which aired in November 2023. The piece was focused on the state of blues in Clarksdale, Chikan's hometown, and featured, along with Chikan, Christone
